Uber to offer free rides to the polls for wheelchair users, people with disabilities and the elderly

For this Thursday's General Election, Uber will be offering free rides to and from polling stations in partnership with a number of leading disability organisations.

Together with <u>Scope</u>, <u>Whizz-Kidz</u>, <u>Transport for All</u> and a number of local organizations, Uber is helping ensure everyone can cast their vote.

Trips to and from polling stations between 7am and 10pm on Thursday, December 12th, will be free up to £10 per trip.

Wheelchair users will be able to redeem two Uber Access trips to travel to and from polling stations in seven cities across the UK including London, Manchester, Birmingham, Newcastle, Leeds, Liverpool and Brighton.

The offer also extends to Uber Assist trips for those who need additional assistance but do not require a wheelchair accessible vehicle.

Uber Assist is available in more than fifteen cities across the UK, and is regularly used by older people, riders travelling with assistance animals, those who have visual or hearing impairments and riders with foldable wheelchairs.

Existing users of Uber Access and Uber Assist will be given a special code to access the free rides and new users will be sent one by charities such as Whizz-Kidz, Transport for All and Scope.

Jamie Heywood, Regional General Manager of Uber in Northern and Eastern Europe, said:

"We're proud to provide options for people who require additional assistance in more than 15 cities across the UK, including wheelchair accessible vehicles. We believe that everyone should be able to have their say, so we're delighted to be working with organisations like Whizz-Kidz, Transport for All and Scope to offer free trips to and from the polls this Thursday."

Ruth Owen OBE, Chief Executive of Whizz-Kidz, said:

"When Uber launched wheelchair accessible vehicles in London, many of the young people Whizz-Kidz works with were pleased to have another accessible choice for getting around town. We are pleased to partner with their scheme for free rides to and from polling stations for wheelchair users."

James Taylor, Head of Policy, Campaigns and Public Affairs at disability equality charity, Scope said:

"Disabled people often rely on public transport and taxis to get around. When transport is accessible it makes life much easier for disabled people, so it's great that Uber is continuing to provide accessible options. We're pleased to support this initiative to help make sure disabled people can get out and cast their vote."

Kirsty Hoyle, CEO of Transport for All, said:

"We are pleased to share this opportunity from Uber with our members, a long-standing idea from their team which intends to offer a free and accessible option for disabled and older people to vote in the upcoming election. Too often disabled people are isolated by societal barriers that limit their opportunities to participate in the parts of life that others take for granted and we hope this encourages everyone to get out and vote."

Geraldine Desmoulins, Chief Officer of Possability People, said:

"Possability People's experience is that disabled people often have fewer options for getting out and about; walking, taking the bus, nipping out in the car - the things that most of us take for granted are not always viable. Accessible transport can make a huge difference to people's lives and we welcome the opportunity to work with Uber so that disabled people can get to a polling station."

Mark Baker, Co-Chief Executive of Age UK Bristol, said:

"Age UK Bristol is proud to work in partnership with Uber. The 'Uber to the polls' campaign will help ensure that everyone has the opportunity to place their vote on the 12th December, even if they have mobility issues."
